- Main contents: The exhibition will introduce the Winter Olympics and Paralympics, with a focus on the Winter Games held in Japan. It will include exhibits of newspaper articles and other documentation detailing the successes of the Hinomaru Hikotai (Hinomaru Squadron), the Japanese ski jump team that dominated the podium at the 1972 Sapporo Games, and the skates worn by Japanese speed skater, Hiroyasu Shimizu, who won gold in the men’s 500 meters at the 1998 Nagano Games.  
During the PyeongChang Games (Olympics: February 9-25; Paralympics: March 8-18), the Japanese athletes’ events will be televised at the exhibition in real time.
- Special Exhibits: There will be an exhibit of the actual Shitamachi Bobsleigh that small local factories from Ota Ward came together to develop and a corner for visitors to experience first-hand the weight of the stones used in the curling competition.
